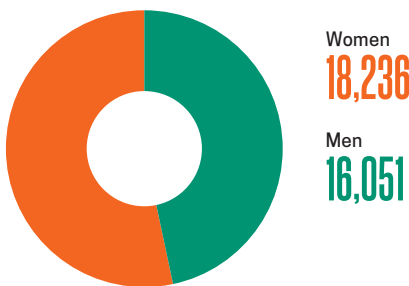

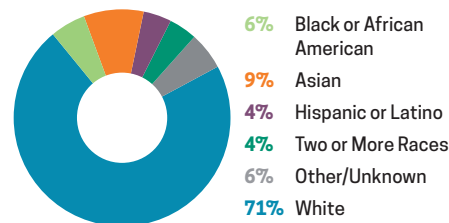

REPUTATION

Pitt is the world's **TOP UNIVERSITY FOR PHILOSOPHY**, according to the 2019 QS World University Rankings by Subject. Pitt also was highly rated for nursing (18th) and medicine (43rd).

In its *Guide to 399 Green Colleges*, the Princeton Review has ranked Pitt among the **MOST ENVIRONMENTALLY RESPONSIBLE COLLEGES** in the United States and Canada. Also, *SIERRA* magazine named Pitt **ONE OF AMERICA'S "COOL SCHOOLS"** for its commitment to environmentalism.

In 2018, Reuters ranked Pitt 37th on its list of the **WORLD'S 100 MOST INNOVATIVE UNIVERSITIES** based on such criteria as research output and patent filings. In fact, Pitt innovators launched 23 start-ups, acquired 98 patents, generated 162 license and option deals, and filed 363 invention disclosures in fiscal year 2018.

Pitt received INSIGHT Into Diversity's **2017 HIGHER EDUCATION EXCELLENCE IN DIVERSITY AWARD** for its outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion.

Pitt's Cathedral of Learning and Allegheny Observatory are designated as landmarks in the **NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES**. Four Pitt buildings have earned Pennsylvania state historic designations, and 17 buildings are Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation Historic Landmarks.
